

Allocation of places to King's Academy Binfield

Secondary Phase 2019/20

The following information is based on the initial allocation at 1 March 2019 of applications received by the deadline of 31 October 2018. This information provides you with a statement on how places were allocated in line with the published admission arrangements at King's Academy Binfield.

150	The school was fully allocated. Places were offered down to those applicants who fulfilled the no criteria, to a distance of 1.684 miles from the school according to the radial distance policy listed below. There were insufficient places for the 61 remaining no criteria applicants. These applicants have been placed on a waiting list.

King's Academy Binfield – Admissions Criteria 2019/20

When the school is oversubscribed, after the admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care plan naming the school, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in priority order:

1. Looked after children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order.
2. Priority will next be given to children based on their exceptional medical or social needs. Each application must include evidence, from a medical specialist or social worker of the child's need and why they must attend this school rather than any other, based on those needs. If evidence is not submitted to the local authority with the application, a child's medical or social needs cannot be considered. An additional form will need to be completed.
3. Priority will next be given to children living within the secondary phase catchment/designated area set out in the map at the end of this policy and who have siblings attending the school at the time of the child's admission.
4. Priority will next be given to children living within the secondary phase catchment/designated area set out in the map at the end of this policy.
5. Priority will next be given to the siblings of pupils attending the school at the time of the child's admission.

Tie-break

If there are still insufficient places and no distinction can be made between the applicants or if they do not fulfil any of the above criteria, a final decision will be made on the *radial distance* (straight line distance on a map) between the home and the school. Those living nearer to the school will be placed higher than those living further away. Radial distance will be based on the co-ordinates for the property and the school as defined in the Local Land and Property Gazetteer and based on the Ordnance Survey's national system. Random allocation will be undertaken if the distance between a child's home and the academy is equidistance. Random allocation will not be applied to multiple birth siblings (twins and triplets etc.) from the same family tied for the final place as they will be admitted at time of allocation.
