Reminders:

Thank you for sending your children to school looking so smart. We know that some of our uniform rules are stricter than other local primary schools, but we are also preparing these children to enter the secondary phase at KAB and do not want to allow something in the primary phase only for it to change as they enter the secondary phase. Clear consistent rules are easiest for all and the children look incredibly smart. Just a reminder about some of our important uniform policy points:

- No bows or other adornments in hair
- Hair to be tied back if longer than shoulder length
- Only one small plain gold or plain silver stud to be worn in the ears (no sparkles, hoops etc)
- Trousers, socks and tights to be plain black with the winter uniform
- White socks to be worn with plain white trainers for PE
- No branded/logo items
- Shoes should be plain black, flat and logo free (no trainers or boots)
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If you have any questions regarding our uniform policy, please email our admin address and your email will be forwarded to the most appropriate person to help. **Our PTA has a wonderful selection of pre-loved uniforms for anyone needing any extra!**

I know that at both sites, parking has been a challenge at the start and end of the day. We are extremely lucky to have any parking onsite as many other local schools do not, however it can be extremely frustrating as a parent to be stuck trying to get your child to and from school. Please remember that your child can arrive anytime between 08:30 - 08:45 and so you do not need to be at the academy for exactly 08:30. Once you have dropped your child into class, please move off straight away to allow another parent to have the space. At KAB please be mindful of the secondary students entering and leaving the academy. At KAO the building work is causing a slight headache for parents, please rest assured that Miss Scully and I are in constant communication with the site manager to try and make things easier for everyone. Children and adults must not ride scooters or bikes anywhere on site. Please ensure that all toddlers and students disembark before entering the academy grounds.


