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Ash


Word of the week: Thoughtful

Ash class have had an exciting couple of weeks! They absolutely loved going out of school on a local area walk this week for our Geography topic. We were spotting different human and physical signs and had some brilliant discussions about nature along the way.

Last week, in English, we explored the story 'Can't you sleep, Little Bear?'. The children matched different vocabulary to the pictures and came up with some of their own to begin getting them to use exciting 'wow words' within their writing. This week, we have been focusing on 'Owl Babies'. We have been doing some role play of the story with stick puppets where they got to come up and perform the story to their peers. I was so impressed with the different story language the children were including!

We have begun our 'Toys' topic in History this week where the children sorted old and new toys. We looked at the different materials used and had some fantastic discussions about how wood toys are coming back due to the environment.









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Birch

Birch have been very creative over the first few weeks this term. They enjoyed creating their own firework art by using straws and blowing paint using such beautiful colours for Bonfire Night. The children have also enjoyed making finger-print poppies for Remembrance Day. Some made about 5 each!

As well as all of this art, children have been exploring the creative arts and composing rhythms and learning how to play them using different percussion instruments. They all worked so wonderfully together and really impressed me with their composition skills.

This half term in Science, we have been thinking about materials and all the different properties learning exciting new words to describe them. We went on a walk around school taking photos of all the objects we could find around school that had been made of plastic, metal, wood and glass. The class were so good at finding very obscure objects in every corner of the school.















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Chestnut

Chestnut Class have made a super start to the new term and have impressed me with their inquisitive nature and their excitement for our new learning.

In Maths, we have been learning to use column addition and subtraction to add and subtract larger numbers. I have been so impressed with the way the children have not only grasped these new concepts but also their ability to explain the reasoning behind the methods. In English, we have been working very hard on punctuating speech accurately within fiction writing. There is a lot to think about and remember when using dialogue in writing but the children have been doing this with great accuracy.

We have begun a new geography topic of the Rainforest this term and the children have thoroughly enjoyed using an atlas to locate countries where rainforests are found. We have explored the location of these countries in relation to the equator, the tropic of capricorn and the tropic of cancer. We have also been comparing the climate to that in the UK.

In Science, we have continued our topic of Rocks and Soil with a focus on soil. We have explored the different layers of soil and what it is made up of. We have explored how soils are different as a result of different minerals. The children were very excited to bury 100% cotton socks in different places around the field. When we dig them up in eight weeks, we are hoping to find lots of holes as this will show the soil is healthy, due to the presence of lots of microorganisms.

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Pine

Word of the week: tangible

What a fun start we have had to this term in Pine class. The children continue to amaze me with their independence, hard work and creativity.

In English, we have been learning how to describe a setting. We have had great fun writing spooky stories; focusing on using our senses, choosing rich descriptive vocabulary and opening our paragraphs in a variety of ways. Ask your children about DADWAVERS.

In maths, our topic has been length. We started by learning to convert between mm, cm, m and km and then extended this learning to learn about perimeter. We had great fun working in groups to create our own shapes in the hall and then investigate the best ways to get an accurate result. Well done to those who figured out what the string was for.

In science, we started learning about changing states and set up an experiment to investigate influences on evaporation by growing salt crystals in various locations around the classroom.


In geography, we identified key British rivers and used an atlas to locate them on a map. We've also started a research project on a famous river of their choice which the children will prepare on Google Slides and then teach to the class. In RE, we started a new unit on Christianity and debated the most important thing that Jesus said.
