# **Head of Primary News:**

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am really pleased to report that Covid cases have dropped hugely amongst staff and students. We are hopeful that the next few months will continue with less disruption than we have seen over this term. Even with the challenges of bubble learning, the teachers have been incredible at offering wonderful learning opportunities for your children which will be expanded over the coming terms.

I am extremely excited to let you know about our 'Friday Enrichment Offer'. Every Friday afternoon, after half term and until the end of the academic year, all adults within school (teachers, support staff and admin staff) will be running enrichment sessions which will teach the children new skills or give them the opportunity to take part in something that interests them and furthers their learning. The sessions on offer cover things such as: ballet, STEM, cookery, craft, first aid, nature, construction, computing and much more! The children have applied for three different sessions and will find out which enrichment course they will be taking part in after half term. We will of course share updates on these sessions with you in the newsletter.

# **Opportunity and Success on a Global Stage**

Opal:

Word of the week Last week: venomous This week: population

Opal class have been continuing with their unit on continents in Geography. The children are now experts at finding continents on an atlas and have so many interesting facts about the 7 continents! We have particularly enjoyed learning the continent song and also what animals can be found on each continent. In English, we have been using our knowledge of the continents to create an information booklet. Their writing for this has been wonderful! I am so proud of how much effort they have all made with their information booklets.

In Maths over the last two weeks, we have been learning about place value to 50. We have been exploring numbers and how many tens and ones they have along with how this can support us to order and compare numbers to 50. In Music, the class had a fantastic lesson last week where they had a first try at playing recorders!

In Computing this half term, the children have been practising logging into Purple Mash and creating their own digital artwork. In Art over the last couple of weeks, we have been creating our own shoebox habitats! The children used their research and designs from the beginning of the half term to think about what materials they were using. I am so impressed with their habitats, they look incredible!







Topaz:

Word of the week Last week: data

This week: biodiversity

Topaz class has had a wonderful last two weeks of this half term. They received lots of messages from Fairy Land after reading Instructions, by Neil Gaiman and Charles Vess. They did a favour for Mayor Bon-Bon (the Mayor of FairyLand) when all the punctuation in FairyLand was stolen and received maps of FairyLand as a reward. The children wrote the most amazing instructions on how to travel safely through FairyLand.

We finished our class reader Fantastic Mr Fox and wrote detailed character descriptions of Mr Fox himself. In Maths, the children have been doing statistics. We learned how to collect data in a range of tables including tally charts, pictograms and block diagrams. The children worked hard to interpret the data and ask and answer questions.

In Science the children made their own paper (which has come out as a slightly fragile almost cardboard like consistency) and have begun an experiment to investigate the biodegradability of different materials.

Finally, as a class they have collectively received more than 1000 dojo (or house) points this year and their reward was an afternoon of making slime in the secondary science lab with some assistance from the amazing staff and students from the secondary science department.
