### House system

- Curie (red), Nightingale (green), Churchill (yellow) and Mandela (blue)
- Healthy competition; sports, debating, rewards, spelling bees ...
- Opportunities for house collaboration 3 18
- Leadership opportunities
- Sense of family, especially important as we grow
- Book bag/ tie (KS2) colour depends on house group



### Uniform

- Very high expectations of uniform from EYFS upwards
- Both schools the same except for polo/shirt colour (KAB – white, KAO – powder blue)
- Tartan pinafore or black trousers/shorts, King's polo shirt, cardigan or jumper. All King's from Stevensons – no others permitted
- PE kit of shorts, King's navy polo shirt and optional sweatshirt
- Jewellery one single plain silver/gold stud only
- Will morph into secondary uniform as students progress through the school. Shirts and ties from year 3.



# Dates and Times of School Day

- Mostly compliant with Bracknell Forest term dates
- Core primary school hours: 8.45am 3.30pm (Flexible drop-off from 8.30am)
- Wrap around care 7.30am 6.00pm
- After school clubs 3.30pm 4.15pm
  First day of term Monday 5th September
- September 5th 2 hour settling session (am or pm)
- September 6th and beyond all day

### Academy Catering

- All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a meal, free of charge, under the Universal Free School Meal programme.
- Using SchoolComms, parents will be able to login and select either a meat or vegetable main dish or a jacket potato for their child.
- The menu will be published in advance on SchoolComms and parents will be required to select meals a week at a time.



- Alongside the meat and vegetable main meals, children will receive a dessert and access to a salad bar, bread, fruit and yogurt each day.
  - Chartwells will cater for all diets and provide personalised meals for students where required, for example an allergy-you must complete a form and attach medical correspondence. After this, a personalised meal plan will be provided.



### Important General Information

- If you child is unwell, please let the office staff know as soon as possible.
- Differing amount of time off needed for different illnesses -speak to office (48 hours after last sickness).
- Please label everything!
- Named water bottle every day.
- Children only need to bring-book bag, water bottle, hat, coat and PE kit to school (lunchbox).
- Termly information about the curriculum sent out and uploaded onto our website.
- Absence will only be approved in exceptional circumstances.


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

Flexible drop off and morning activities Phonics Literacy/Maths input and adult led groups Free Flow Activities (inside and out based on 7 areas of learning). Lots of play. Snack Tidy up time! Lunchtime Rex the Retriever time Free flow activities PE/Spanish/Library time/Enrichment sessions Milk Trim trail time Storytime

### How can you help your child to be ready for School?

Lots of chatting and playing with language!

Enjoying books and stories. Visiting the Library.

Engaging in imaginative play with your child.

Playing card and board games, modelling turn taking and negotiating conflicts!

Helping your child to understand and follow rules and routines- tidying up their toys and helping with chores.

Enjoying singing, dancing and moving with your child



Fine motor development e.g. playdough, Lego, threading

Playing with letters and numbers. Lots of counting. Spotting numbers and sounds out and about!

Recognising their name/writing name if possible

Changing into PE kit and back into uniform. Practising taking coat on and off and fastening zips and buttons.

Painting, mark making, drawing and creating!




Encouraging use of cutlery and independence when eating- opening packets etc.
