### Word of the Week (last week): Gravity Word of the Week: Eclipse

We've had another 'Out of this World' couple of weeks learning about Space! The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the different planets in our Solar system and are able to recall lots of interesting facts about them, such as how Jupiter has lots of moons,

how Mars is red because of Iron in the rocks and soil and how Venus is named after the Roman goddess of love! Acting out the solar system in our garden helped the children to remember the order of the planets and understand how they orbit around the sun. The children have also enjoyed listening to the music of Holst and guessing which planet each piece in the suite is about. There has been some incredible writing about the planets this week- it is wonderful to see the children's independent writing skills flourishing in preparation for Year 1.

As well as learning more about the planets, the children have discovered more about what a solar eclipse is this week and enjoyed some moon crater maths where they had to solve a mission working out how many moon craters there were! In PE, we have been practising for Sports Day and we can't wait to see you there, cheering us on!

In Spanish, Emerald Class have enjoyed learning more about Spanish cuisine and had fun in our Food Tech room this week cooking up the Spanish dessert 'Leche' Fritte'. They utterly enjoyed devouring the sweet milky treats!





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
# Opal

Topaz class children have had a wonderful week. They have worked hard to write their own book reviews and I have selected some to go to the library where they will hopefully help other children to choose some great books to read! The children have completed all their end of year Maths assessments and we are now using this final month to build confidence and fluency in key areas of maths that we know they will need next year.

In history, the children did some great source work looking at photos from Shackleton's 1914 expedition to Antarctica (see photos below).
