Dear Parents and Carers

In maths we have been counting to ten and learning number names. Our stories in English have helped us to make lists and write captions.

Year 2 have made an amazing start to the year and have come back from holiday ready to learn! We have started lots of learning on place value and began planning and writing our own adventure stories about Traction Man! The children have been especially excited about learning about the Great Fire of London. Well done on a great start to Year 2!

CHESTNUT CLASS

Year 3 have really impressed us with how well they have settled into Key Stage 2. We have had a busy week in maths learning all about numbers to 1,000. The children used base tens to count in hundreds, represent numbers to 1,000 and partition numbers to 1,000. In science, Year 3 carried out an experiment using Starbursts to show how sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous rocks are formed. In History, the children learnt what humans needed to

PINE CLASS

We have had a great start to the year in Pine Class. The children have come back to school with a great deal of energy and enthusiasm for their learning. In Maths, we have been working on number and place value and have been exploring representing and partitioning numbers to 10,000 in different ways.









SYCAMORE CLASS

In Sycamore class, we've had a fantastic first few weeks back. I'm impressed with how quickly we've started to settle back into a school routine.

So far in geography, we've been concentrating on maps. We practised using an atlas by searching through the index to find the correct page and coordinates for a given country. We also used Ordnance Survey maps to look at the surrounding area and try to comprehend the symbols depicted and why they are significant if we are unfamiliar with a place.

We have begun our topic on materials in science. Our first lesson was all about categorising materials based on qualities like transparency and stiffness. We've also been practising gymnastics in PE, remembering the different shapes, how to construct balances, and then transitioning them into a routine.







OAK CLASS

The children have returned to school with enthusiasm and are settling in well to Year 6. We have dived straight in and are busily working our way through our learning this term. We are very excited to have new opportunities as house captains this year and have been working on creating formal speeches in our English lessons for this purpose. We have been revisiting our learning of place value and learning about negative numbers in maths. Our afternoons have been filled with activity as we begin learning topics. We have about our new paleontologists in science, understanding information that fossils can provide; explorers of the Americas, looking at the climate and tundras that exist in these continents and understanding what it means to be committed in RE.


