MEASLES/MMR REMINDER FROM BRACKNELL FOREST FAMILY INFORMATION SERVICE

Over 102,000 children starting primary school in England are at risk of catching measles With millions of children across the country going back to school this week, NHS England is urging parents to check that their children are up to date with their MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccinations in the wake of measles cases rising across the country.

Childhood vaccination rates have fallen over the past ten years and this week statistics show that over 102,000 children aged four and five years old starting in reception are not protected against catching measles, mumps and rubella. Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.

If you are unsure if you or your child are up to date, check your child's red book or GP records and make an appointment to catch up any missed doses. For more information on the NHS vaccination schedule, please <u>visit</u>.

KAB SECONDARY UNIFORM REMINDER

Here at King's Academy Binfield we are very proud of our high expectations which is reflected in our uniform policy and how we expect students to wear their uniform on a day to day basis. The majority of our students take pride in wearing the uniform as it is meant to be worn. Now the weather is getting colder, students have been reminded that they should be wearing their blazers around the school site. Jumpers can be removed if they become too warm during the school day. From Monday 16th October the small number of students who choose to wear their uniform incorrectly will be issued with a lunchtime detention for 20 minutes, failure to attend this lunchtime detention will result in a same day BAN C3 detention being issued.

PRIMARY PE UPDATE

It has been a busy couple of weeks in the Primary PE sector at both Binfield and Oakwood! Both schools have covered Tag Rugby, Football, Gymnastics and Dance- in their lessons and all children are really showing excitement at learning new areas of PE.

In regards to external events/tournaments, we have seen some fantastic results and progression from last year already. King's Academy Oakwood attended the first cross country race of the season at Reddam House School and 3 of the children finished in the top 10 of their races. The races are divided into 4, with a year 3/4 girls, 3/4 boys. 5/6 girls and 5/6 boys race. The school have never had a child finish in the top 10 before and to have 3 in one day come in the top 10 was an amazing achievement. In fact, 2 of those were in the top 5!

King's Academy Binfield went to the year 3/4 Cricket Skills festival which went really well and a beautiful sunny day. The children learned some new skills that can help them become better cricketers but also to really enjoy the game. Some of the coaches mentioned how impressed they were with how the children conducted themselves and their knowledge of cricket.

On Monday of this week, both schools entered into the Year 3/4 Mixed football event which had a total of 18 schools take part. Both schools really enjoyed the day and played some lovely football but it was King's Academy Oakwood that went all the way through and Won the whole tournament! What was incredible was that the final went all the way to penalties and the children held their nerve and composure to come out on top. This was the first time that either of the King's Academy primary schools had won a tournament and the children were on cloud 9. Though Binfield were unable to make the final, the children stayed and supported Oakwood all the way through. Over the remaining days of this term, both Binfield and Oakwood children will be attending a Year 2 football festival at Lambrook School. As there aren't too many events for KSI children, I am always on the lookout and will enter where I can so that they have the exposure of what school events are like and how important it is to show our DARE values. The last event of this term will see our Year 5/6 at Oakwood take part in a Tag Rugby competition.

The last part from me is a little Conqueror Challenge update. As you can see from the below, the children are making some headway having done over 13,000 kms.
