

## WOOD LANE GAS WORKS – BINFIELD SITE

You will be aware that works began this week in Wood Lane. We were not informed of this. Access to drop off and pick up on Wood Lane will be very difficult during this time. Wherever possible, if your child can walk or cycle to school, this will help to reduce the traffic congestion. ## ANTI-BULLYING WEEK AND CHILDREN IN NEED NON-UNIFORM DAY – FRIDAY 18TH NOVEMBER 2022

Anti-bullying week is taking place during the week of the 14th - 18th November and students will be participating in a variety of activities throughout the week that will raise the profile of our newly appointed anti-bullying ambassadors as well as reiterating our zero-tolerance approach to bullying at King's Academy Binfield and Oakwood. The week will start with students invited to wear odd socks on Monday 14th November to promote the theme this year 'everyone is unique'.

King's Academy Binfield and Oakwood will be participating in this year's Children in Need Day on Friday 18th November 2022. Children in Need is a national charity which raises money for disadvantaged children and young people across the country. Last year Children in Need helped nearly 460,000 children and young people to overcome their challenges. This included supporting children & young people living in poverty, providing emergency support to families in crisis, providing comfort to children feeling sad, lost and alone, helping children overcome social injustice and supporting children to feel safe and secure again.

This year the focus of the campaign is 'Be Spotacular', students are invited to wear non-uniform and donate £1 to Children in Need which will be collected during their morning tutor time or by their classroom teacher upon arrival at school. Students may wish to tailor their non-uniform to be 'spotacular'.

Students must ensure that whatever they choose to wear is suitable for travelling to and from school. Clothing must still be appropriate for the school environment, we would not expect students to wear very short shorts or skirts (without leggings), low cut, strappy tops, or crop tops. Football/rugby and other sporting kits should not be worn. Shoes should be of a sensible height and any jewellery that is, large, expensive or of sentimental value should be left at home. Hair colouring is not permitted. If students have PE lessons that day, they will need to bring their normal PE kit in. Students are welcome to wear any of the Children in Need merchandise that is available in local supermarkets currently.

I am writing to inform you of our offer to all Year 11 students following the recent set of PPEs.

From Monday 14th November 2022 (Week B) we will be offering revision sessions each night straight after school, these will run from 3:05 pm until 3:55 pm. A copy of the schedule is below:

Students are able to work out their option blocks by looking at their timetable, a class code of 11B/Ms1 would indicate that subject is in Block B.

Each session will focus on a different skill/concept which has been highlighted through the recent set of PPEs, we will be sharing with students the skills/concepts that are being covered in each session on a weekly basis through the tutor slides as well as on a display board (outside my office).

There are two different types of attendance for these sessions: compulsory and optional. For those students who must attend all/some sessions in a given subject, the subject leads will be in contact with you to inform you. For those students for whom it is optional, they are more than welcome to attend any sessions that they feel they would benefit from. It would be useful for those optional students to inform their teachers in advance so that we can ensure that we have enough resources available.

We are currently in the process of creating a Year 11 revision website which will provide your son/daughter with a single place to access any revision material for each subject. We will also have information regarding examinations and PPEs on this website, in addition to information on our main school website.
