SECONDARY UPDATES

YEAR 9'S WELLINGTON STEM DAY

10 of our Year 9 students spent a day with other local schools experiencing science and DT at Wellington College. They used lots of new equipment in a biology practical n enzymes, took part in building competitions in DT and with the construction company Taylor Wimpey, and found out about the uses and problems with limestone, a finite but very valuable resource. All the students were a credit to the school, really engaging in the activities and making the most of the facilities, including a lovely lunch!





YEAR 8 10X CHALLENGE

This week year 8 have been testing out their business acumen in the 10x challenge. Students have been given £10 to start their own business and have had to think about business plans, marketing, budgeting and sales.

Groups have come up with some amazing business ideas from homemade dog biscuits, to jewellery and from gardening services to car washes.



YEAR 10 GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

Last week the Year 10 Geographers completed their compulsory urban fieldwork; a key requirement of their GCSE studies. Over 3 days we took 76 students out to Reading where they collected data via traffic land use surveys, environmental quality surveying, sketch maps and interacting with the public through questionnaires to explore quality of life variations. The teachers received positive messages from several members of the public as to how smart the students looked and how polite and professional the students were when conducting their questionnaire surveys.

Our congratulations go to the Year 10 students who represented themselves, the teachers and the school marvellously. We are really proud of them and look forward to taking them out on the next trip in the summer term!

YEAR 9 MOCK TRIAL TRIUMPH

On Saturday 18th April, some of our Year 9 students competed in the National Mock Trial Competition at Reading Crown Court. This involved students competing in court against other schools from across Berkshire by acting out a fictional case. Students were allocated roles including lawyers, witnesses and magistrates. We even had one student as the defendant, who was locked into the court's secure room!

Lots of preparation and practice went into the event and on the day there were plenty of nerves, as students had to compete in front of audiences, which included the High Sheriff of Berkshire. Following a nervous wait for the results, the students finished in 1st place which is an incredible achievement for a really tough competition! This means the students have progressed to the Regional Finals which will take place in May. Two students share their experiences below:

"Doing the mock trial, I was really pushed outside my comfort zone, however now I feel more confident speaking in front of people (something which will help in school). I really enjoyed the experience and it was a real insight into law."

"I really enjoyed the real world experience of a court case and experiencing the inside of a court from the magistrate's perspective."
