#### YEAR 10 TEXTILES PROJECT

The Year 10 Textiles students are currently working with a textiles artist Hermione Thomson at South Hill Park Art Centre. It is a collaborative exhibition with our GCSE textiles students, Bracknell Fire and Rescue, Hermione and Wokingham and Bracknell College photography students (who are filming and recording the process). The exhibition is to promote water safety and the hidden dangers within open water.


