YEAR 9 OPTIONS/CAREERS DAY

This week year 9 have been thinking about their GCSE options. On Wednesday students had the opportunity to think about their choices and learn about the sorts of things that might inform the choices that they make. MFL - FRENCH - GALETTE DES ROIS

Our MFL Bake-Off Competition last month was a celebration of world-cuisine but after receiving so many beautiful pictures of cakes, it was time to have a taste!

As part of our GCSE topic on Celebrations and Festivals in France, our Year 10 French students enjoyed freshly-baked Galettes des Rois (Kings' cakes) made by our talented chef Lewis Croombs and his team.

The Galette is traditionally eaten on the 6th of January to celebrate Epiphany and is also enjoyed during the whole month of January in France. A lucky charm – often a small figurine or a broad bean (une fève) – is traditionally placed in the flaky puff pastry layers of the cake called galette. The person who finds the lucky charm in their slice of cake is then crowned king or queen. The round shape of the galette is meant to symbolise the sun and when you buy the galette from a boulangerie-pâtisserie, it comes with a golden crown made of paper.


As per the French tradition, we had our youngest member in the class to distribute the slices to everyone around and we were lucky to crown two kings and two queens.
