Dear Parents and Carers

We were delighted to see parents of year 10 students at parents evening this week. Teachers were pleased to be able to share students' successes and to give feedback to help everyone to make even better progress. TOPAZ CLASS

The children have made a fantastic start to 2023. In English, we have been writing shape poems and the children have done a wonderful job at writing sentences that include alliteration and similes. In maths, the children are now learning about multiplication and division. Our new science topic is an extension from the autumn topic on materials, looking at recycling. They have started an experiment on biodegradability and we will be starting a second experiment on making new paper out of old. If you have newspaper or wrapping paper that could be donated, we would be grateful. The children will be making their own pulp before making paper (which is fun and messy!). They can then look at how the end product is different depending on what type of paper they used.

QUARTZ CLASS

The first couple of weeks back after the Christmas holidays have been fantastic. Quartz class have been so enthusiastic about our new learning and are all showing great determination. We have just started our History learning about the Romans, which the children are applying in their writing, whilst learning about historical stories. Additionally, in Art, we are learning about printmaking, inspired by the artist William Morris.





WILLOW CLASS

Sharing the pictures of their pets with their friends triggered endless conversations among the children as we started our new topic 'Awesome animals'. They created stunning pictures and remarkable models of their favourite pets and challenged themselves to write facts about their beloved pets using their evergrowing phonics knowledge. Willow class have been taking great care of their furry friends in their new veterinary roleplay area, applying bandages on broken wings and giving injections to ease their pain. In Maths, the children revisited their understanding of number bonds to 5 by feeding their dog some bones to create their first number story.







ASH CLASS

Ash Class have had a brilliant start to the term. returning with an enthusiastic attitude to listening and learning. In maths we have been working hard on adding and subtracting to 20, looking or number bonds to 10 to help us. For English we have enjoyed reading 'Meerkat Mail' and writing postcards from Meerkat when he is on his travels. Our science and geography have shown us new places in the world and the animals that live there. When finding out about what animals eat, we made some surprising discoveries about which were carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Using 2paint in Purple mash on the chrome books to make digital art, has been quite a big learning experience for everyone and we are looking forward to practising our skills throughout the term.





CLASSROOM NEWS

BIRCH CLASS

The start of term has been the start of lots of new topics. In Science we are looking a little more at materials and recycling. We are doing a small experiment about biodegradability of different materials where we buried material in the ground and in a couple of weeks we will check how much they have biodegraded. In Spanish we have been practising our greetings and animals using the computers to challenge us. The children have loved beginning to learn the ukuleles in music and have made amazing progress in just two weeks! Well done Birch Class!

PINE CLASS

It has been lovely to welcome Pine class back and they have made a great start to 2023. In maths, we are continuing our topic and multiplication and division. This week, we investigated factor pairs and worked on written methods of multiplication. We started by practically showing the process of multiplication before moving onto written methods. I been impressed by the increased commitment to learning times tables. Please encourage your children to go on TT Rockstars at home as often as possible. In English, we have started a new topic on newspaper reports. The children have enjoyed

reading our FirstNews papers and exploring the fun headlines. We have linked this learning to guided reading and have been finding out more about refugees. In art, Pine class have been looking at paintings of flowers by Georgia O'Keeffe. They have worked on shape and shading to create their own flower sketches; they are really excited to use colour soon!







SYCAMORE CLASS

Sycamore have had a fantastic start to the new year! I've been very impressed with how the children have returned from the holidays eager to learn. In maths, we started with 2 digit by 2 digit multiplication and, while many of the children found it difficult at first, we have finally mastered it and are moving on to bigger challenges with more digits! We've been studying coasts and their features in Geography. We used our atlas knowledge to locate some of these coastal features along our own coastline after learning about how erosion and weathering affect cliffs to form caves and arches. We are revisiting Sikhism in RE. We reviewed the Guru Granth Sahib and Gurdwara before reading some of the stories to determine their moral. This week, we focused on the story of Milk and the Jasmine flower and created our own bowls decorated with symbols of what the world should
