## **JADE CLASS**

We have had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day in Jade Class! The children loved showing off their amazing costumes, going on a book scavenger hunt, reading their personal reading books to Quartz Class and going up to secondary to see all of the fabulous World Book Day decorations! Last week, we continued learning our Little Red Hen Story using the 'Talk for Writing' scheme by Pie Corbett. Still without yet opening the book, the children have been able recite the entire story (even with some of the symbols covered). It has been amazing to see their enthusiasm whilst retelling the story. Hence, during our choosing time, the children have independently become budding authors by creating their own Little Red Hen story books and showing off such wonderful writing! Towards the end of the Little Red Hen Story, the Little Red Hen turns 'corn' into 'bread'. Thus, the children have also become brilliant bakers, working cooperatively to make delectable bread (just like the Little Red Hen) before devouring it in the afternoon!

This week, we have moved away from the Little Red Hen and have begun focusing on the Life Cycle of a Frog. We have learned all about the different stages a frog goes through from frogspawn all the way to growing all four legs and jumping out of the water!

#### **OPAL CLASS**

We have enjoyed lots of practical learning over the last couple of weeks in Opal Class! We have been exploring the rhyming stories 'Oi Frog!', 'Oi Dog!' and 'Oi Cat!' by Claire Gray and Kes Gray. We have been creating a story map and actions to help us remember the events in 'Oi Frog!', and have then innovated the story and changed it to make it our own. We loved practising our innovated stories with our own actions!

We have also continued our Science learning about Everyday Materials. We have been exploring the properties of different materials, and using specific vocabulary to describe them. We learnt words such as transparent, opaque, rigid and waterproof. We enjoyed a carousel activity where we collected words to describe the material laid out on the table e.g. glass, metal.









# **TOPAZ CLASS**

Year 2 had a wonderful World Book Day at the start of the month, they enjoyed reading to children in Reception, taking part in the World Book Day assembly, doing the scavenger hunt around school and decorating our classroom door! This week, the children have been working hard on telling time in maths. The children are growing in confidence with 'o'clock', 'half past' and 'quarter past' times. Please help them to continue practicing all this but most especially 'quarter to' times. In English, they have written the most incredible information texts on mythical creatures – they could choose whether they wrote about a fairy, a troll, a griffin or a phoenix.

## **QUARTZ CLASS**

In Quartz class we have had a fantastic couple of weeks. We really enjoyed World Book Day and we won our door decorating competition! ## **ASH CLASS**

Ash have been having fun learning about measuring and comparing height and weight. We've enjoyed using many different objects and getting involved with measuring.

During our science lessons, we have been continuing to investigate materials. This week we tested materials to see if they were: transparent, flexible, magnetic, absorbent or waterproof.

We have tasted fruit in preparation for planning our smoothies, which we will be making in the last week of term. Bananas and strawberries were very popular.

One of the highlights of the last two weeks has been the snow! We had a great time exploring it in the morning and were even able to make a tiny snowman!

English has given us the opportunity to write our own version of 'Oi Frog!' by Kes Gray. We used Talk for Writing to get to know the text and learn how to organise the sentences. The children were very good at using the correct punctuation and suggested some well thought of rhyming ideas.

We also had a great time on World Book Day. The costumes were amazing.









# **BIRCH CLASS**

Birch class have been working really hard on their writing at the moment. They have had great fun designing and making up their own mythical creatures, preparing to write an information text about them. Some of the ideas are so imaginative and we are going to put their work together to make a class book!

In geography, we have been learning about biomes and the impact climate change has had on those biomes. The children were very passionate about what we could do to protect our wonderful planet from the effects of climate change and made posters about it.

We were very lucky to have had a special cricket session last week. We were given an introduction to the sport and the skills and the children had a great time!

#### **CHESTNUT CLASS**

This week, Chestnut Class have been busy learning all about light and reflection in Science. We enjoyed testing how reflective different materials and found out that shiny materials tended to act as mirrors whilst dark colours absorbed the light. Pine class recently used their Maths' skills to work out how many laps of our football pitch it would take to make a 1-mile / 1600 metres (approx) circuit. The challenge was to walk a mile, some of us managed to run all of it and some of us travelled even further than a mile - more than ten laps!

In design and technology (DT), we have started to create our very own panpipes. Through research and demonstrations, we proved that plastic plumbing pipes were too wide to make sounds by blowing and that wax did not work as an adhesive. Most of us are making a card set of pipes because we can measure and cut them easily, join them with rubber bands or string AND use our favourite colours!






