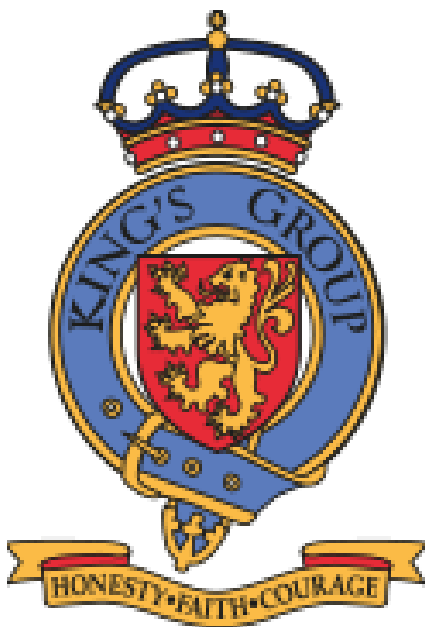

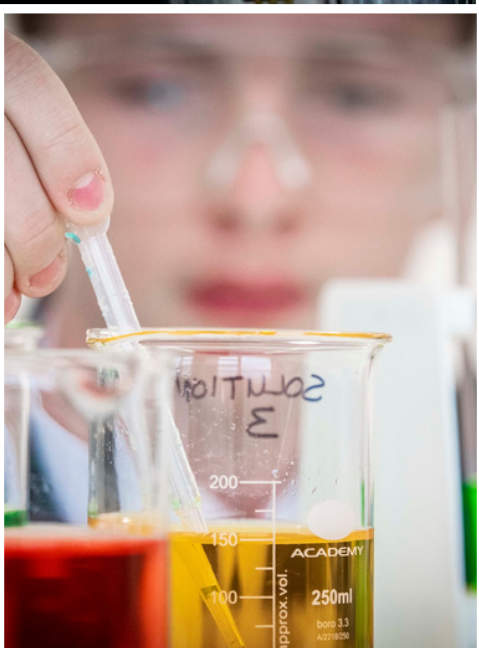

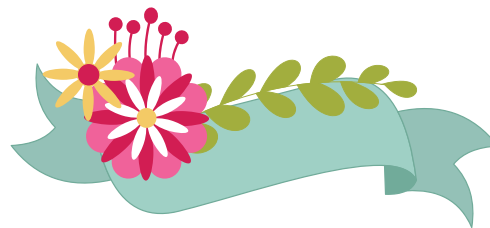
WILLOW CLASS

The children have started rehearsing for their class assembly on Thursday 4th May and look forward to seeing all on the day!



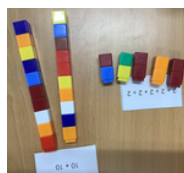
ASH CLASS

We have had lots of fun dressing up as rock stars and enjoyed using Numbots, which we hope they will also enjoy using at home.

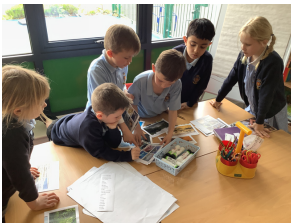


PRIMARY/SECONDARY UPDATES

This week we learned about world habitats and organised animals into which habitat we thought they lived in based on their adaptations.

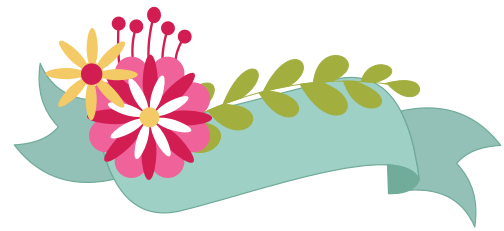

SYCAMORE CLASS

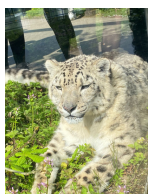
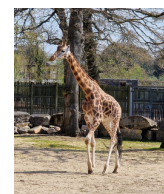
