Willow class enjoyed practising some Sports Day events in PE this week. They were full of enthusiasm, especially for the sack race, which they were determined to master!



We have had such an exciting last two weeks in Birch class. Last week we were lucky enough to go to Milestones Museum on a beautiful sunny day. The class travelled with Year 2 from KAB on a coach and for some children it was their first time on one! We went into groups looking at how vehicles changed over time. We were so lucky to go there and we were even given a ration book to use in the Victorian sweet shop. Rosey apples were the group favourite!

The children have been really enjoying their History topic of Explorers and have been learning a lot about Ernest Shackleton and Amelia Earhart. They even got to look at old pictures from Shackleton's expedition and had to match them to captions. They loved seeing Endurance stuck in the ice! We also watched the recent news report where Shackleton's ship had been found at the bottom of the sea in March.

In science we have been learning about animals and their habitats and we have thought about their adaptations allowing them to live in different environments. We looked at what adaptations animals who lived in hot environments had and also cold environments. After some research, the children then got to design their own animal, thinking about where they might live and what their adaptations would be. The children came up with some fascinating creatures!

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Chestnut

In English this week, Chestnut class have begun writing their very own character descriptions of The Grand High Witch from Roald Dahl's The Witches. The children are thoroughly enjoying the story and have been captivated by the character of the Grand High Witch. In Science, we are learning about Light. The children have thoroughly enjoyed using torches to test how reflective different materials are. We will be moving on to experimenting with shadows and how they change depending on the location of the light source in the coming weeks.

We are thoroughly enjoying our current History topic of the Ancient Egyptians. This week, we learnt all about Ancient Egyptian beliefs surrounding mummification as well as different stages of the process. We brought our learning to life by mummifying bananas! First we cleaned them using water from the 'River Nile', then used a paperclip as a hook to remove the banana and its vital organs. We then dried out the bananas and have left them in salt to dry out. Hopefully next week, once the bananas have dried, we will be able to continue with the next stage of the process!

Chestnut worked on their teamwork skills in PSHE this week. They learned how important it is to listen to each other's ideas and to share their experience in order to solve problems. Would you be able to hold up the same pieces of paper as your partner, without facing each other? Or turn 3 triangles into 4 by only moving two sides?

In English, we finished our unit on Greek myths. The children created their own heroes (many of them turning their own names into Greek names by adding eus) and invented their own villains. Using everything they have learnt this year, they wrote a full story and in true Greek myth style ensured it definitely did not have a happy ending.

In maths we have been learning about properties of shape. The children can now identify different quadrilaterals by recognising their properties. Do ask them to tell you the names of all the different types of triangles and quadrilaterals. They have also had great fun with mirrors and using them not only to admire their reflections but also for finding the line of symmetry in a variety of shapes.

In history, we have been researching the achievements of the Ancient Greeks. Split into teams, we found out about the advancements the Ancient Greeks made in a given subject (astronomy, Olympics, democracy, mathematics, architecture and medicine). We then collated our findings into a poster and presented it to the rest of the class.

We are sad that our gymnastics lessons will be coming to an end with Miss Andrews soon but we are so proud of how far we have come. We really pushed ourselves this week, all of us showing great determination to achieve a lasting handstand.
