Willow class had a wonderful last week getting to know their brood of chicks before they returned to live a free-range life at Row Farm. The children came up with some great names for our chicks such as Cuddles, Wobbly and Spotty. The farmer loved the names we chose! The children cared for them so well and although we are missing them we have been pleased to hear from the farmer that they had settled well with their new mum. The children wrote some lovely cards for the chicks to take with them to their new home.

We weren't without feathery friends for long though as on Wednesday, Lizzie from the British Hen Welfare Trust came to run a special workshop to help the children learn even more about eggs and chickens. She brought two of her rescue hens, Tinsel and Pocket. Willow Class loved being able to stroke them and were fascinated to find out that chickens have 3 eyelids and to find out how a chick grows inside an egg. Lizzie also helped us understand the difference between caged and free range eggs and reminded us how important it is to buy free range eggs. The children enjoyed trying to break eggs by squeezing them- we discovered just how strong eggs really are!

This week our learning has focused around the Queen's platinum jubilee. We have learnt lots about our Queen and her family. We've been preparing for our street party on Friday by making Union Jack flags, bunting and making some grenadiers puppets! We have also learnt the national anthem so we can sing it at our street party. The children have been absolutely flabbergasted that our Queen has reigned for 70 years- we all think it is an amazing achievement.

We also looked at the results of an 'egg-speriment' we have been doing in class to see how different drinks affect eggshells which is a bit like the enamel on our teeth. We discovered that milk and orange juice did the most damage to the shells and that water was the best!

We also said goodbye to our butterflies that hatched last week. The children enjoyed watching them flutter away as they clumsily spread their wings for the first time. Some butterflies needed a little extra nudge and cheers which the children were happy to provide!

Have a fabulous half term everyone, I can't quite believe next term is Willow Class' last term of Reception but what incredible Year 1s they will be!

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Ash



I must firstly say that I was very proud of Chestnut Class for the mature and sensible manner in which they behaved throughout the day. They represented the school wonderfully! The children thoroughly enjoyed spotting the animals in the different enclosures and finding out facts about them all by reading the signs in the zoo. It was wonderful to see the children spotting things in the zoo that related to their learning throughout the year.

In maths, we have been learning time. We revisited telling the time to 5 minutes and then moved on to telling the time to 1 minute as well as looking at units of time: seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, years, decades... Please continue to talk to your children about time, especially getting them to tell you the time on analogue clocks. This is a very important skill but is difficult to teach in just a couple of weeks at school.

In English, the children have had great fun designing and building their own robots. Using persuasive devices, the children wrote a script for a TV advert in groups and then filmed and edited their adverts.



At the beginning of last week, our Buddhist community celebrated Vesak (Buddha's birthday). This linked perfectly with our RE so we held our own celebration by making lamps and origami lotus flowers. We also did a lantern parade in the school grounds.



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In Art, we have been learning about flags and how they can provoke, entertain and represent people. The sunshine was just too good to miss, so we headed outside to create our own flags that represent us! We can't wait to see their finished pieces of art.
