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Term Time Holidays

Students have missed out on so much in school learning over the past two years that it is really alarming to see children being removed from school for a second, or in some cases, third term time holiday! Whilst I completely understand that holidays are important for you as families and that some learning can take place during holidays, taking children during term time has a hugely detrimental effect on their learning. Some families take their children out of school at the end of each term which means key assessments are not completed, the children do not get the opportunity to consolidate their learning and they miss the end of key topics and learning.

Term time holidays will never be approved for this reason and I ask that you book holidays within the 13 weeks school holidays. Some parents have even asked staff to set work for their children to complete on holiday; this is a completely unreasonable demand and unfair to expect teachers to add to their workload by organising additional work.

We keep regular track of attendance with our minimum expectation being 97%. I completely understand that small children get ill and need time off, however I do have a duty to invite parents in next term and arrange for attendance plans to be put into place to support students with low attendance.






In Science, we have finished off out 'Materials' topic by sorting different objects into various groups. For example, some children put them into groups based upon their properties or what materials they were made from.










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Chestnut




