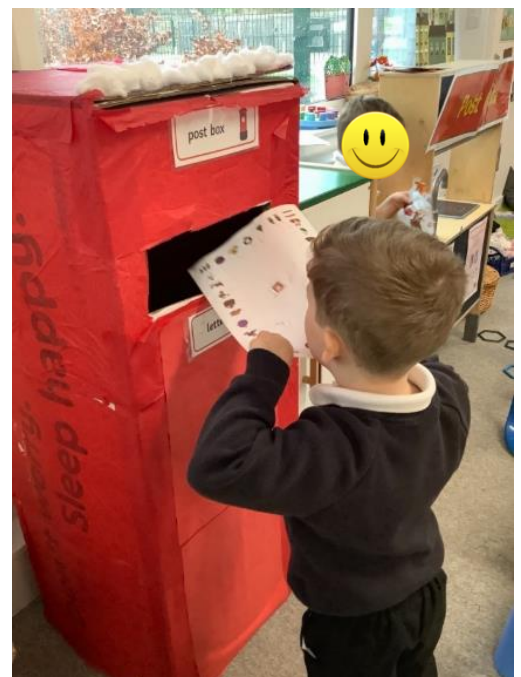

Topaz Class

They have also built a model of Pudding Lane substituting the wooden buildings with cardboard and creating the tudor style using white and black paper. We will be placing our buildings close together and burning it very soon to notice how the fire spreads (some of the children are hoping for a strong easterly wind to add some more authenticity).

In maths, the children have been learning about the value of the different coins and notes. Selecting coins and notes to make different amounts and beginning to practise paying and getting change. We will carry on with this, adding a festive theme, next week and completing our end of term maths assessments.
