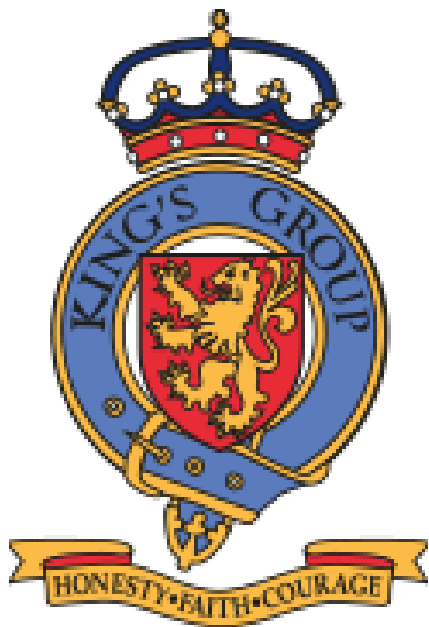

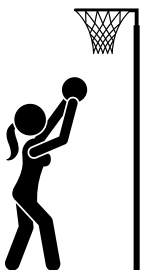
YEAR 9 BOYS RUGBY
